## **REASONS TO CONSIDER**

#### Leveraged Short Exposure to Canadian Equities

HIX offers investors the inverse (opposite) exposure to the daily performance of the S&P/TSX 60 Index, providing a strategic tool to potentially profit from declines in the large-cap segment of the Canadian stock market.

#### Target Level Exposure Without Margin

HIX allows investors to gain leveraged short exposure to large-cap Canadian equities without the need for a margin account, mitigating the risks associated with margin trading while still accessing amplified performance and offering a more controlled approach to leveraged investing.

#### Acting Hedge

HIX can serve as an effective hedging tool for investors with long positions in the S&P/TSX 60, allowing them to hedge out daily or short-term market risk on their holdings. By providing inverse exposure to large-cap Canadian equities, HIX helps investors mitigate potential losses during market downturns, thereby protecting their investment portfolios and preserving capital.

#### **INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE**

HIX seeks daily investment results, before fees, expenses, distributions, brokerage commissions and other transaction costs, that endeavour to correspond to one times (100%) the inverse (opposite) of the daily performance of the S&P/TSX 60  $^{\scriptscriptstyle \rm M}$  Index.

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#### DEFINITIONS

Volume: Real-time volume on the Toronto Stock Exchange only.
